





# **Health Careers Opportunity Program (HCOP)**

CDU-AltaMed HCOP Ambassador Academy is a pipeline program that offers mentorship, case management, clinical shadowing experience, workshops, community meetings, and need-based scholarships for undergraduate and graduate students who are passionate about serving the local community as health professionals.

<u>Up to \$10,000</u> in need-based scholarships distributed with future funding contingent on successful participation.

#### **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

- Must be a U.S. citizen, national, or foreign national with a permanent residency visa
- Current CDU student in good standing enrolled full-time in one of the following programs:
  - o M.S. in Biomedical Sciences
  - o MPH in Urban Health Disparities (1st year only)
  - o Post-baccalaureate Program in Pre-Medicine
  - o B.S. in Biomedical Sciences
  - o B.S. in Public Health
  - B.S. in Psychology
- Educationally or economically disadvantaged\*
- Must not have previous equivalent degree or subsequent degree (e.g., ineligible if enrolled in BS program but have MS degree in another area)

You are <u>STRONGLY</u> encouraged to apply early because submissions will be considered on a rolling basis beginning **July 1, 2022**
